CNLP Program Updates

We ask all those who hold the CNLP to take note of the following:

- All current holders are in a grace period. All recertification renewals need to be submitted by March 1, 2022. If you have your materials together now, you may still submit in 2021.
- 2021 will be a year for obtaining further professional development and credits in support of the CNLP.
- Until further notice, no new CNLP applications will be accepted.
- No CNLP Examinations will be conducted this year.
- Following the determination of the Professional Development Committee, the NYSNLA Office will now begin processing all CNLP renewals that have been submitted, to date. Anyone who has submitted information will receive confirmation of processing from the Office in early February.

Additionally, we will be holding "The CNLP Update"—a webinar where all holders of the credential can join us to learn about all these updates, see demonstrations of how to use the website to update their profile and utilize the new CE Tracker, as well as have questions answered. This webinar will take place in mid-February, and you will receive an invitation and reminders.

Standby for the Release of the CNLP Review Manual!

The Professional Development Committee constructively used the pandemic-time to complete an overhaul of the *CNLP Review Manual*. It has been a stumbling block for years, and this year we made it our mission to conquer it. We're thrilled to report that we are very close to achieving our goal! Each chapter has been revised and updated with current information, photos and links. The new manual will be an electronic version that will be accessible by logging-in through the certification tab on the new NYSNLA website.
